Small Group Questions

1 Peter 1: 1-12

Questions to ponder as we get to know a little about each other:

- How many times did your family move when you were growing up?
 Which time was the hardest?
- How geographically scattered is your family now? How often do you get together?

Questions to help us dig into the Scripture:

- What was the situation in Rome at the writing of this letter?
- What, according to verse 2, is God the Father's role in initiating a Christian's salvation? What part does the Holy Spirit play?
- What does Peter mean by the "new birth" God, in his mercy provides (v. 3)? What are God's plans for a Christian's future (vv. 45)?
- What perspective does Peter give suffering in verses 6-7?
- Despite their suffering, how does Peter describe his audience's spiritual relationship and outlook (vv. 8-9)?

Questions to help us apply the Scripture to our own life, to take personal inventory and share with the group what you are going to do as a result:

- When have you felt like a "stranger in the world" (v. 1)because of your faith? What helps you through those times?
- How has the Spirit stirred a longing for God's forgiveness and holiness within you?
- How aware are you of God's shielding power that Peter describes? What part do you play (v. 5)?
- In times of personal crisis, do you tend to lean more on God or blame God? Has suffering made you bitter or "better"?
