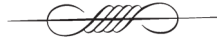

Small Group Questions

2 Corinthians 10: 3-5 (Read vv. 1-18)

Questions to ponder as we get to know a little about each other:

- Is “authority” more of a positive or a negative word to you? How so? Why is that?

Questions to help us dig into the Scripture:

- Things have improved in Corinth since Paul wrote his last letter (7:8-16), but not altogether. How is Paul discredited (vv. 1-2, 9-11)? How is Paul’s gentleness and meekness being misunderstood? Where have you seen Paul’s strength and concern for others?
- How is Paul’s exercise of authority(vv 3-8) different than his usurpers, the so-called “super-apostles” (see 11:5,20)? How and why does he play upon their boastful attitude?
- How do you feel about Paul’s “reprimand” here in defense of himself? Do you see it as strength or weakness when a person admits his or her limitations? Why?

Questions to help us apply the Scripture to our own life, to take personal inventory and share with the group what you are going to do as a result:

- From Paul’s example here, what is supposed to be the “normal” way Christians exercise leadership over one another? On a scale from 1-10, how well do you demonstrate Christ’s gentleness and meekness in leading others?
- What will you work on this week that demonstrates your interest in building others up?
- When is it right to show “tough love” by demanding that someone change? What risks does it involve?
- As an act of “tough love”, what worldly, anti-God thoughts prevail in your circle of friends or family which you can “take captive” and “make obedient to Christ” (v.5)?
