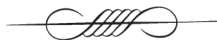



Small Group Questions

Luke 11: 42 (read verses 33-54)

Questions to ponder as we get to know a little about each other:

- When you were a child, who insisted that you wash up before meals? Who insisted that you wear clean clothes? How did you react to this fussing?

Questions to help us dig into the Scripture:

- What is the natural and surprising thing Jesus does to open this scene (v. 38)?
- How does the Lord turn the tables on his host? What is his basic point about the Pharisees (vv. 39-41)?
- In your own words, what is the meaning of these three woes directed at the Pharisees (vv. 42-44)?
- What is the point of these criticisms?

Questions to help us apply the Scripture to our own life, to take personal inventory and share with the group what you are going to do as a result:

- Typically, Jesus is thought of as “meek and mild”. What is the significance of this passage’s presentation of Jesus for you?
- Of the three woes directed to the Pharisees, which one is Jesus directing most to you? Why?
- Of the three woes directed to the lawyers, which one has your name on it? Why?

Session Highlights: October 2019

- The new Church bus will arrive by the end of October. A buyer is being sought for the current bus.
- Session members will have a retreat on 11/15-16 at Harvey Cedars.
- Safety Improvements are underway in the Children's area. This includes a buzzer system for retrieving children, sign-in/sign-out procedures, improved door security and security cameras. A safety expert will be scheduled to meet with Session.
- Two baptisms were approved!
- To meet legal requirements, Session approved Joe Hare as President of the Corporation and Nick Aponte as the Treasurer.
- Session is seeking additional MPC Presbytery Commissioners. If you are interested, please contact Pastor Fettig. Current and former officers are eligible.
- Storage space in Dale Hall is limited so please remove any and all items where the Worship Team practices!
- The Session approved a gift of \$20,000 to CityTeam for their expansion of supportive faith-based housing for young women and for their new initiative to create a Mobile Food Market, both in Chester. This gift was made possible due to the generosity of the Dunn/Cherry Fund.
- Following input from the congregation, Session approved three changes to the sanctuary to improve space and allow for better access for those with physical mobility needs. Visit our website for more details.
